APPROVAL OF MINUTES

February 18, 2021: A motion was made by Karofsky, seconded by Ring, to approve the minutes. The motion passed unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS ITEMS

2. 2021 2022 Capital Budget

The chair noted the typo in the agenda, it should say 2022 Capital Budget

A motion was made by Karofsky, seconded by Verveer to approve the 2022 Capital Budget request. The motion passed unanimously.

3. Budget Discussion

The Capital Budget Request for 2022 encompasses several large expenses that are vital to the continued functionality of the building and after having been deferred for years, can no longer be postponed. City Finance has advised Monona Terrace to submit the Building and Building Improvement projects request in the amount of \$1.18M. The city will use General Obligation (GO) borrowing for this. The City is required to have GO debt on the Convention Center in order to have a Room Tax rate of over 8%. The Machinery and Other Equipment request of \$215,000 will be funded through room tax. The total Capital Budget request is \$1.4M.

4. Room Tax Fund Update: David Schmiedicke, Finance Director

The 2021 room tax fund is expected to be down \$4.4M. There will be \$47M in ARPA funding coming to the city. It can be used towards revenue loss up to 4.1% of growth over 2019 base year. It can be used towards government services but it cannot be use to directly replenish reserves. Monona Terrace will likely have a \$2.1M cash deficit in 2021 largely due to reduced Room Tax subsidy. It will require assistance from the city.
