b. Testimony, introduction of exhibits, and examination of witnesses by Contractor or Legal Counsel;

c. Comments from the contracting department, if any;

d. Questions from the AAC Appeals Subcommittee of witnesses.

5. Closed Session

The Affirmative Action Commission Appeals Subcommittee may, by proper motion and majority vote, convene in closed session during the course of this appeal for one or more of the following purposes, as authorized by Wisconsin Statue:

• Deliberating concerning a case which was the subject of any quasijudicial hearing before the Subcommittee, under Wis. Stats. Section 19.85(1)(a).
