- Park Patron Input
 - PlaygroundManufacturer Options
 - o Colors

Playground Meeting

- Review project scope, budget, & timetable
- Discuss site factors to consider
- Present two options for manufacturer selected at first meeting
- Consider alternative components, as needed

Final Design

 Present final design for feedback via email (this may not be necessary if consensus is reached at the previous meeting)

WHAT MAKES A PLAYGROUND INCLUSIVE?

- 1. Allows for users of all abilities and developmental stages to play in the same space and "side by side" wherever possible
- 2. Considers the needs of all users and incorporates play equipment that addresses those needs
- 3. Recognizes that individuals living with cognitive, sensory, intellectual and physical challenges benefit from play and outdoor activity
- 4. Offers a range of experiences including tactile features, contrasting colors, sheltering/quiet zones, sound elements




